Pre War:

He was the son of George Gray. He had been born in Hitchin. His home address was 17 St. Andrew's place, Hitchin.

Wartime Service:

His Regimental Number was T/406687 and he served at the M.T. Depot in Hitchin.

He probably served in the 728th Motor Transport Company which had an unusual role for the A.S.C. as part of the 37th Local Auxiliary Company (Signal Service Training Centre). This unit was formed on the 28th June 1916 and disbanded on the 31st March 1919. The A.S.C. became 'Royal' on the 27th November 1918.

He was buried in Hitchin Cemetery in Grave N.E. 623. His Commonwealth War Graves Commission stone has the additional inscription "*Gone but not forgotten*".
