**Pre War:**  
He was the son of William and Hannah Green.

**Wartime Service:**  
He enlisted in Hitchin where he resided and was allocated Regimental Number 156311. He served in 'B' Battery of the 156th Brigade in the Royal Field Artillery who were equipped with 18 pounder guns. He was fatally wounded in Belgium.

The unit was probably near the Menin Road with the 33rd Division at the time of his death.

He was buried in Plot XXVI, Row C, Grave 2A in the Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery in Belgium. This cemetery was used by several Casualty Clearing Stations in the area and is near Poperinghe. A private inscription was added to his gravestone reading "*Gone but not forgotten*".
