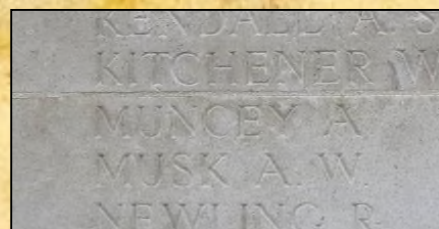

Pre War:

His home was at 10 Chapman's Yard, Queen Street, Hitchin. He was the son of Mr W.C. Muncey of 2, Wallham Rd, Highbury, Hitchin.

He resided in Hitchin and had been an employee of the Hitchin Urban District Council. He was a member of the Union Jack Football team and Miss Farmer's bible class.

Wartime Service:

Arthur enlisted in Hertford and was given the Regimental Number 4139. He was already serving with the Herts Regiment by December 1914. He was killed in action during the time that the Regiment was in France with the 118th Brigade of the 39th Division although the Herts were not engaged in the early months of fighting on the Somme. A shell hit him and according to the newspaper report his last words were "I am finished. Let mother know".

He has no known grave, but is remembered on the Loos Memorial to the Missing in France.
