### **Pre War:**

His parents were Mr and Mrs H. Munt of 13, Cannon's Gardens, Hitchin and Henry was born in Hitchin. He was the husband of Violet Louisa Munt and almost certainly the brother of T.R.H. Munt. Another brother was Robert Munt who served in the Cambridgeshire Regiment. Violet's maiden surname was Page.

### **Wartime Service:**

Henry served in the 2nd Battalion of the Regiment and his Regimental Number was 26024, although his name does not appear in the 'Soldiers died' database as the war had ended by the time of his death.

He died of wounds from gassing and is buried in Hitchin Cemetery in Grave south east 88. A visit in 1999 failed to locate evidence of his grave.

### **Additional Information:**

Son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Hunt, of 13, Cannons Gardens, Hitchin; husband of Violet Louisa Ellis (formerly Munt, nee Page), After Henry's death Violet remarried and became Mrs Ellis of 37, Glebe Rd., Letchworth, Herts.
