Pre War:

His home was at 5, Whitehill, Hitchin. He was the son of Emma Whittred and the husband of Bertha Elizabeth Whittred of 5, White Hill, Hitchin, Herts. He joined up in 1916.

Wartime Service:

Frank went to France in January 1917. He was posted to the 1/5th Battalion of the Regiment and taken prisoner by the Germans during their Great Offensive in 1918. He died of exposure and privation as a prisoner of war.

He is buried in Row M, Grave 9 in the Sissonne British Military Cemetery in France.
