Pre War:

Born in 1880 in High Wych, Hertfordshire son of William and Sophia Samuels. He married Mary Ann Samuels on 23 Jan 1904 in Roydon Church and they lived at Cock Green, Great Parndon and later at 9 Western Terrace, Nursery Road, Hoddesdon. They adopted her sister's son Richard William Judd on the death of his mother and had a daughter of their own. He was a horsekeeper.

Wartime Service:

Enlisted at Saffron Walden on 30 Dec 1914 and entered France on 25 May 1915. He returned on 3 Mar 1916 and served at home until 16 Feb 1918 when he was transferred to the Labour Corps because he was unfit for duty overseas and died at home in Hoddesdon from lobar pneumonia.
